

Week 3: When Disaster Strikes: Folau's story

"Preparations are underway for the construction of the new church as a Lighthouse for refuge and for worshiping God. I am a carpenter; I was selected to be part of this construction, and despite my disability, I still have the courage, because God provided a miracle for me when I survived the tsunami."

The local church in Tonga is the centre of the civic and spiritual life of the village. When

it suffers damage in a cyclone or other disaster, it's often the first place the people rebuild - sometimes even before they finish fully securing their own homes. That's because it's such a significant symbol of faith and resilience. It's not only the sacred place where God dwells, but it's where the people gather to draw on each other for strength.

Mr Folau's village on Attata Island was completely destroyed in the 2022 tsunami and it was unsafe for the community to return. His ancestors had lived there for generations. He said that leaving the island broke his heart, but that he knew for the sake of the safety of his family, they must leave and start a new life on the mainland. Part of finding the strength to begin again was knowing that he could be part of the rebuilding of the church. He and others have been stockpiling supplies and Folau will help oversee the new building, which will have pride of place in the new village that has been constructed on land donated by the King of Tonga in the north of Tongatapu. <u>Watch his story here.</u>


Ideas for personal action this week

What difference do your personal travel choices make?

- Transport accounts for about 25% of global CO₂ emissions, with cars being a major contributor.
- A full bus can replace up to 50 cars and a train can replace hundreds, cutting emissions per passenger by up to 80%.
- Reducing car use decreases air pollution, traffic congestion and demand for road expansion.
- Could your church offer a carpool option for people to attend services? If you left more time, could you take public transport instead of driving? Could you plan your week so that you need to take fewer short trips to the shops?
